Within ABM, we reinforce the importance of safety through our <u>Safety Absolutes</u> and <u>ThinkSafe™</u> program. These basic safety principles provide clarity about our standards and expectations that certain high-hazard tasks must not be done by any employee who has not received proper instruction and training. Managers are required to train employees to stop and refuse unsafe work until a safe environment can be assured. All employees are expected to work in accordance with the standards set in ABM's Safety Absolutes.
