## Sistemas Leed de Mexico Donates Time, Supplies to Mexico City Earthquake Relief

As earthquake relief efforts continue to provide support and rescue efforts in Mexico City, Mexico, the staff of **Sistemas Leed de Mexico**, a Linc Service franchise since 2011, are volunteering time, food and water to help victims.

“Sistemas Leed de Mexico is giving tremendous support with food and water for the victims of the earthquake in Mexico City, in addition to providing voluntary working hours to rescue people trapped in some of the damaged buildings,” said Sofanor Alarcon, a Linc Service and TEGG Area Vice President. “I am very proud of the Sistemas Leed de Mexico team and Principal Eduardo Aldape as they continue to help the Mexico City community.”

The 7.1 magnitude earthquake happened on the afternoon of September 19, causing widespread damage throughout Mexico City. As of Friday, Sept. 22, officials have confirmed 146 deaths as a result of the earthquake.

The earthquake marked the second time the country had been hit by an earthquake in 12 days. On September 8, an 8.1 magnitude earthquake south of Mexico City. In all, the death toll from both earthquakes climbed to 286 as of Friday morning, according to **news reports**.

While the search and rescue efforts continue, government officials in Mexico are observing a three-day national mourning period.
